

RAM Defense LLC Members' or Close Associates' Personal Crime or Cop Notables

(truthfully presented to show some of our perspective)

- **Victims of violent crimes:**
 - Were assaulted/battered numerous times.
 - At least one of those incidents was reported to the police who took a statement/complaint but asserted they couldn't do anything about it—despite the fact they had the license plate number.
 - Had a gun pointed at them by a non-cop.
 - Were sexually assaulted.
 - Consequently, it led to the decision to carry.
 - Were victims of robbery.
 - Had to confront numerous threatening dogs.
 - Bit on at least three different occasions.
 - Dogs they owned attacked.
 - Nearby dog killed by a violent dog.
- **Victims of non-violent crimes:**
 - Were victims of burglaries:
 - At least seven times.
 - Four of those incidents were reported to law enforcement with all the evidence.
 - No charges filed by prosecutors.
 - One incident responding officer blamed the victim and said, “If you would have left the door unlocked they wouldn't have had to break in [damage your property].”
 - One incident involved nearly \$1,000 stolen that took a week to reclaim.
 - OPM confirmed all their private personal data taken in a data breach including Social Security Number, name, address, date and place of birth, residency, educational and employment history, personal foreign travel history, information about immediate family and business and personal acquaintances and any other information used to conduct a background check.
 - Had front door kicked in.
 - Had three cars vandalized.
 - Had a car shot.
 - Had property trespassers.
 - Had mentally ill neighbors.
- **Other noteworthy:**
 - Had their next door neighbor commit suicide outside in their driveway with a firearm while they were home.
 - Had two relatives shot to death (one in combat, one in civilian life).
 - Had a neighbor who was a suspected domestic abuser and admitted car thief.

- Had to call the police 11 times in just one 4-year period.
- Discovered someone they met was wanted for murder.
- Discovered two people they met were serial burglars.
- Narrowly survived death from a gunshot (non-injury/barely missed).
- Know someone who is an attempted murder victim who suffered numerous gunshots.
- Know at least 5 people that have been shot.
- Were informed they were “on a list” and used by government in training exercises.
- Had a rape occur in the alley behind their house.
- **Mistreatment by law enforcement:**
 - Were escorted out of their car at gun point and detained for approximately ½ an hour for being legally armed.
 - No charges.
 - While still in the womb/in utero, a municipal police department harassed their mother to the point that the telephone company disconnected one of the police department’s phone lines and the county sheriff had to investigate the police department.
- **Association with law enforcement:**
 - Have a relative who was a long-time law enforcement officer.
 - Have good friends who are/were cops:
 - Two retired law enforcement officers.
 - Two current law enforcement officers.
 - One officer who quit the police force due to its corruption.
 - Had a relative who was a security officer.
 - Have a relative who was a long-time adult abuse and rape crisis intervention social worker.
 - Lessons from this:
 - Men are commonly victims of abuse by women.
 - They either cannot or will not report it and/or press charges.
 - Always have a means of self-defense.
 - Evil abounds in many perverse forms including, sexual, physical, psychological and emotional.
 - Was a NARA-trained high-level security clearance multi-year government records archivist in charge of enforcing, analyzing and advising on records laws and treatment for all counties within a state including sheriff departments and coroners/medical examiners and half the state agencies. Additionally, a reference librarian i.e. an access records custodian for criminal case files, prison records and other law enforcement and government records of all types.
 - Had a sheriff’s deputy tell them if their kids were older they could be charged with terroristic acts for playing with plastic Air Soft guns in their own yard—the same sheriff’s deputy that was later convicted and sentenced of felony first degree criminal damage to property and misdemeanor falsely reporting a crime for shooting up someone’s cabin, attempting to destroy the evidence, and falsely reporting.
